
Revelation 10

2nd Interlude 10:1-11

- A. Purpose of interludes
 - The last interlude in Rev. 7 showed what will happen to the church when these troubles come
 - 2. This interlude explains what the church should be *doing* during the troubled times ahead



- 1. Description:
 - a. Clothed in a cloud He was from Heaven
 - Rainbow above his head Reminder of God's mercy from Genesis chapter 9
 - c. Face as the sun Represents glory
 - d. Feet as Fire Fire usually represents judgment
- 2. Holding a little scroll
 - a. It was open
 - 1) This indicates that the message is for the present time an not the distant future
 - 2) Compare to Dan 12:4, where the message was sealed because it was for the distant future
 - b. Maybe it was the message of 11:1-13?
- 3. Feet was on the land and the sea Indicates that his message was universal

C. The seven thunders

- 1. They were to be sealed up rather than written down
- 2. No more warnings
- 3. God tells us what we need to know, but we don't need to know everything.
 - a. It is best not to speculate
 - b. Mt 24:36 No one knows the day or hour God has not told us everything
- D. The days of the 7th trumpet
 - 1. There will be no more delay (Greek: "time") Time will run out
 - 2. At the 7th trumpet, Gods will have accomplished his will
 - 3. "Mystery" of God
 - a. 1 Pet 1:10-12 It was a mystery to the prophets
 - b. Eph 3:4-5

c. Col 1:26 - The mystery has been made known

E. John becomes a participant

Revelation

- 1. He is told to each the scroll
 - a. He devours the book and makes it part of himself
- 2. The scroll is both sweet and bitter
 - a. The word can be sweet
 - 1) Ezek 2:9 3:6 Sweet
 - 2) Jer 15:16 Delightful
 - 3) Ps 19:10; 119:103
 - b. The word can also be sour Jer 20:7-8 - Sour
 - c. Why is it sweet and bitter here?
 - It is sweet because there is a message of mercy
 - 2) It is bitter because of a message of judgment
 - 3) Similar to the "aroma" of 2 Cor 2:14-16
 - a) To those being saved, it is the aroma of life
 - b) To those perishing, it is the stench of death
- 3. There will be more bittersweet
 - a. John would prophesy about many peoples, nations, etc.
 - b. The message is not always pleasant

 Some refuse to listen, making it bitter
